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PROFILE

I am an anthropologist of heritage, cultural and memory politics, and urban change in Eastern Europe. I am interested in the links between political economy and discourse in how the past is managed and mobilised. My work focuses on how heritage institutions and professionals work in contexts of crisis, revolutions, armed conflict and rapid political change.

Since 2014, I have worked predominantly in Ukraine, focusing on how the Maidan revolution, the Donbas war and later the escalation of the Russian aggression in Ukraine shaped the mandate, vision and stakes of heritage and memory institutions.

My current research explores how legacies of past violence, especially displacement and mass repression gain new traction in the ongoing war in Ukraine, what this means for local memory activists in Halychyna (Galicia), and for Polish-Ukrainian relations.

I have worked as an applied researcher and consultant for clients like FCDO, the British Council, and in grants funded within programs like H2020 and EU JPI-CH. I managed a large-scale UAV surveying of Jewish heritage sites across Central-Eastern Europe.

I am a published author and translator. My debut book won the Margó Award for Best First Book and was shortlisted for the Libri Award in 2022. In 2023 I was awarded a Junge Akademie fellowship by the Berlin Art Academy in 2023-4. I translate Ukrainian poetry into Hungarian, most recently a collection of selected poems by Serhiy Zhadan.
